Lieutenant Colonel Davison joined the Army in 1985. Early service included postings to Catterick, Germany (including Berlin), Colchester, Londonderry and Cyprus. He was an instructor at the Infantry Battle School and Sandhurst.

He returned to Regimental Duty in 2014 as Quartermaster 2 LANCS in Weeton. His tour as Quartermaster included the re-subordination from 1 Mech to 42 Inf Bde, overseas exercises in Latvia, Kenya and Belize, and the G4 preparation for the Battalion's Op TOSCA and SHADER deployments. He moved to the School of Infantry as SO2 Operations in 2016, the staff lead for Infantry individual training. He was assigned as Episkopi and Troodos Station Commander from September 2018.
