Dear Parents / Guardians

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Already two weeks into the final term of the academic year, I hope this letter finds you and your families well. The weeks either side of the half term break have been incredibly busy and the absence of this year's exam series has once again meant that students in Years 11, 12 and 13 will rely upon Teacher Assessed Grades, which have this week been submitted to exam boards for moderation. In getting to this stage, students and staff have demonstrated in equal amounts a commitment and attention to detail that will ensure the students' efforts are fairly rewarded and I look forward to sharing in the celebration of their success, once the final results are published this August. As a reminder, this year's exam results days are as follows;

- A-Level results will be published on Tuesday 10th August 2021
- GCSE results will be published on Thursday 12th August 2021

However, it has not been all work and no play! On Wednesday of this week, Year 11 celebrated the end of the year in style, attending this year's School Prom at The Crowne Plaza in Limassol. It was a spectacular evening, coupled with all the glitz and glamour you would of course expect. A popular teacher, there are certainly a number of students disappointed to see him go and I am personally grateful for his support and expertise leant to our school and community. The start of this term does however welcome two new faces amongst our staff: Katie Gardener joins us in the PE Department. Katie is very familiar with St John's having completed her teacher training with us some years ago. Colin Guyton also joins St John's in the role of Assistant Headteacher adding capacity to our Leadership Team.
