

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Progress Tests

Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 will sit Progress Tests in English, Maths and Science this coming week. Progress Tests will be used at the beginning and end of this academic year. They are designed to measure attainment and allow comparison at an individual, cohort and school level with national averages.

Each test assesses a student's knowledge, understanding and application in the core subjects, helping to indicate possible gaps in learning in order to inform interventions. Detailed reports are obtained from these tests, which will be made available to parents. Each report analyses key dimensions of learning for each subject and provides staff with question-by-question breakdown to help identify those students who require greater challenge and those who may need extra support.

Students will sit Progress Tests at both the beginning and end of the academic year, next sitting them in June 2023. The purpose of doing so is to externally validate teacher assessment and track progress at an individual and cohort level. Individual reports will show you as the parent whether your child has made good progress, whilst providing specific suggestions for addressing areas for development. Cohort reports will provide me, my senior and middle leaders with a higher level view to inform classwide activity, as well as staff training and development needs.

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E-Praise Parent Communication App

St John's School has purchased a platform that provides parents with the opportunity to download an Application from the App store that will facilitate improved communication. We will be trialling the App in the coming weeks in the hope we will be able to launch it successfully with parents at the beginning of October 2022.

The App will allow parents to:

- See your child's school profile
- View your child's timetable
- Track your child's attendance
- Monitor your child's homework
- Sign up your child to after school enrichment activities
- Book appointments for upcoming Parent Afternoons
- Download your child's reports and other document including newsletters and school letters

The launch of the App will happen simultaneously with our whole school approach to homework.

Student Setting

In support of our shared moral purpose to eliminate educational disadvantage caused by mobility, students in Key Stage 3 find themselves in mixed ability classes. In each year there are three classes composed of students from a wide range of academic abilities and experiences. The coding of each class is for the sole purpose of timetabling and is not linked to an academic set of any kind. The only exception to this at Key Stage 3 is in Science.

A wealth of academic research exists around the advantages and disadvantages of setting in schools. The topic of setting often sparks strong debate and can polarise opinion. It is however the stance of St John's School not to set students. Research points to the fact that setting students reinforces educational disadvantage, reinforcing gaps in learning, adversely impacting upon a child's self esteem and contributing to lower expectations of certain student groups.

In an effort to eliminate educational disadvantage our staff are being supported to improve our educational offer by meeting student needs through Assessment for Learning, which subsequently informs the use of differentiated learning activities to either support or challenge students to make progress.

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Meet Mr Steve Dixon, Assistant Headteacher

Hello, my name is Steve Dixon and I am honoured to be Assistant Head Teacher at St John's, responsible for Teaching and Learning
