How did Mo inspire me?
Farah is the 2012 and 2016 Olympic gold medalist in both the 5,000 m and 10,000 m. He is the second only athlete to win both the 5,000 m and 10,000 m titles at successive Olympic Games. I love to run and he inspires me to be the best I can be. Mo's fastest 10km race was in 26:46.57, my fastest is 50:24.37. He is almost double the speed of me. How amazing is that!

Born in present-day Somalia, the then Hussein Abdi Kahin was trafficked from Djibouti to London under the name of another child, Mohamed Farah, at the age of nine where he was forced into child labour. He has only recently revealed this about himself. To go through such a difficult upbringing and still become a double Olympic champion is just inspirational.

Why do they inspire you?
Two young black girls from Compton, California. Trained by their father, himself a self-taught player and coach, who have grown up to be two of the greatest players in tennis history.

Throughout their illustrious careers, Venus and Serena Williams have shattered every glass ceiling put in their way. They have shattered into all-time champions. It's starting out, they practiced on courts littered with broken concrete and streets of glass and often with absent nets but they persevered, improving daily. They have achieved so much. Venus is an all-time great. She has won two US Open titles, two Wimbledon championships and an Olympic gold medal in singles. Serena, respectively, is perhaps the greatest player in tennis history, with 23 Open era records, 23 Grand Slam singles titles and an Olympic singles gold medal of her own.

How did Clive Sullivan inspire me?
Clive was the first black captain for the Great Britain team and for any national British Sporting Side.

Clive A. Sullivan MBE (born 9 June 1943 in Cardiff, died 8 October 2020 in Cardiff) was a Welsh footballer and a member of the Wales national football team. He played for Cardiff City, Arsenal, and the Wales national football team. He was the first black captain of the Wales national football team and for any national British Sporting Side.

After growing up in the shadow of his father, an aspiring footballer, he required approval in football, to be seen and to achieve. Due to the nature of these situations, a right career was not always the best option. He, however, chose to pursue his dream, to play football for his country, to be a role model for young black players and to inspire them to achieve their dreams.

Meet Mrs Kate Parkinson

Safeguarding Assistant

Hello my name is Kate Parkinson and it is an absolute pleasure to have joined the Pastoral Team as Safeguarding Assistant here at St John's School.

We arrived here in Cyprus as part of the Battalion move in early July and are loving every minute of it. We have been here before, back in 2015, so we are familiar with the Cyprus life and were excited to return.

I have been a Military wife for over 13 years, and have a good understanding of the struggles and complexities that this life can bring.

I have worked in both Primary and Secondary schools and started my school career as a receptionist in a Primary School in Catterick. Whilst at this school I moved into the role of Attendance Safeguarding Support Officer. When we left Catterick and moved to Chester I continued my role as an Attendance Officer but in a secondary School. After a few months, I found myself supporting the Pastoral Team more often and subsequently moved into the role of Head of Year 9. I stayed with my year group through Year 9 and 10 before sadly having to leave them due to our move out here. After working in both Primary and Secondary education I can honestly say that Secondary education is where my heart lies. When we were told we were moving here I knew I wanted to work in St John's and continue to support young people. I learn from the students just as much as they learn from me! Every day is different and the students always provide 'laugh out loud' moments that other jobs cannot always provide.

I have not always worked in education and started my working life as a hairdresser in London. I trained with Vidal Sassoon when I left school and my claim to fame is working with David Beckham's sister Joanne. Although I qualified in the trade, it was not something I wanted to continue but did come in handy during Covid. My two children Dexter and Alfie were able to remain well kept throughout and even my dog Fletcher benefitted from my cutting skills.

Parent Forum

Yesterday (13th October), I had the pleasure of meeting with a small group of parents who helped me form our Parent Forum. This Forum began a year ago and meets every six weeks in the penultimate week of each half term. The Forum provides parents the opportunity to meet and discuss issues concerning their child's experience here at St John's School.

This year's Parent Forum series began with an evaluation of our whole school improvement priorities and the early progress being made towards them. We looked at the following strands in detail:

Safeguarding Provision
Safeguarding provision is 'exemplary' and supports other MOD Schools in improving their provision.

Attendance
Student attendance is **above 95%**, exceeding the national average.

Educational Offer
The educational offer is consistently 'Good' ensuring St John's School ranks in the **Top 5%** of schools nationally for student progress.

Community Pride
The community is **proud** of St John's School, celebrating the strengths and successes of a school which exceeds their child's previous school experience.

ST JOHN'S SCHOOL
Eliminating educational disadvantage caused by mobility

Student Mobility
St John's School is a centre of best practice; eliminating educational disadvantage caused by mobility. **Student progress exceeds 0.38**

Staff Wellbeing
Staff at St John's School valued; motivated by a shared moral purpose there is a collective sense of purpose and achievement. **Employee turnover is less than 5%**

Student Satisfaction
Students are **highly satisfied** at St John's School, possessing an attitude towards their learning that exceeds that of all other students nationally.

Community Pride

Parents articulated a community feeling of renewed optimism that surrounds the school and its strategic direction of travel. However, this optimism is tempered slightly by the need to be patient to see how this early promise manifests itself into concrete actions and whole school improvement that positively impacts upon each child's school experience. Parents did cite significant improvements in how the school now communicates at a macro level, both in the form of weekly newsletters and through our social media presence. It was however, agreed that effective and frequent communication is still limited at a classroom teacher level and this is something requiring further improvement.

Educational Offer

Significant discussion was had around the quality of teaching and learning in school. It was agreed that the signifiers of good teaching are present and well articulated by students. It was also agreed by all that there is urgent work needed around meeting student needs, particularly those of the more able. Skilful use of student data is needed to differentiate effectively in lessons and ensure necessary stretch and challenge is provided. This is something that the school is aware of and is responding to through professional development opportunities.

Assessment and reporting was discussed and it was agreed that historically there has been significant grade inflation, which was evident in this year's GCSE and A-Level exam results where the school had predicted students would do better than they actually did. Although reflective of the National Exam picture, we have changed our approach to assessment this year, to ensure that students undertake robust assessments that require recall of content taught in previous years. Assessments are subsequently moderated in partnership with King Richard School, Dhekelia, to ensure an accurate understanding of where students are working at. This will lead to a deflation in student grades in next week's reports, but it will provide an accurate insight into student progress based on standardised testing that can accurately inform appropriate interventions.

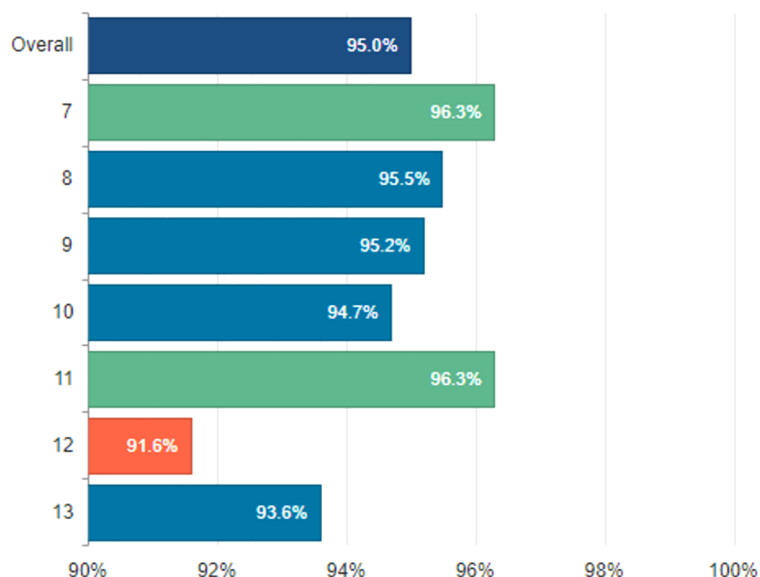

Attendance



Our whole school attendance currently stands at 95% and is at risk of falling below our target of 95%, which is the expectation set by the UK Government.

As previously shared, there is a direct link between good school attendance (greater than 95%) and academic outcomes.

There has been recent confusion between authorised and unauthorised school absence. Authorised absence, is absence approved by the Headteacher, however, despite its authorisation it is still an absence from school and there-

fore subtracts from a child's overall school attendance. As a school, we have a legal obligation to intervene where a student's overall school attendance is less than 95%, even if there are known and genuine reasons. I am aware that this can cause frustration, however it is very well intended to ensure students have the very best opportunity to succeed from their time here at St John's School



100% attendance – the very best chance of success. Well done if you currently have 100% attendance!



95%+ attendance – your attendance is good; well done and keep it up! Can you manage 100% attendance for a whole term?



93%+ attendance – try to improve on this, week by week. Intervention and support in school will be taking place.



Less than 93% - you should work hard to **immediately** improve your attendance. If you have any concerns, speak to your tutor. We will support you in any way we can.

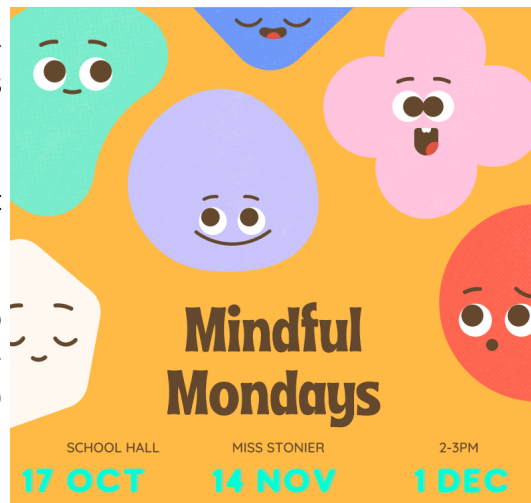
Mindful Mondays

Nut Free School

As you will likely be aware, a significant number of our staff, students and visitors have a severe allergic reaction to nuts and peanuts. Severe allergic reactions result in anaphylaxis.

Nuts and Peanuts can cause severe allergic reactions in a wide range of ways. A person with an allergy does not have to eat nuts or peanuts to have a severe reaction, this can be caused by surface contact and airborne particles. This allergy affects approximately 1/50 children and adults.

In recent years we have seen a sharp increase in snacks containing peanuts and a rise in the use of peanut butter in sandwiches.

As a school we have a responsibility to keep our students, staff and visitors safe and to reduce risk of harm. As you can imagine in a busy school environment this can be a challenge and following consideration, we feel the only way to protect those students is by removing the allergens from the school.

What this will mean?

- Peanut and nut based products will no longer be sold in the canteen.
- Students, staff and visitors **will not** be able to bring products containing nuts or peanuts into school. Items that are found to break this rule will be confiscated and disposed of safely.

What products will not be allowed in school?

- Peanuts and nuts and products containing peanuts or nuts.
- Peanut butter or peanut based chocolate snacks (Snickers/Reece's pieces etc).
- Items where peanuts or nuts are listed as main ingredients.
- Nut or peanut based oils or products.

What products are allowed?

- Items that "may contain nuts" and "may contain traces of nuts" or "made in factories that use nuts" These present a low risk and are not direct ingredients in the products.
- All other non-nut based snacks and food stuff.

Year 10 Mathematics

Following our first assessment and data capture which will be sent home to parents shortly, I wanted to explain the new class structure for Year 10.

We are fortunate to now have an extra Mathematics specialist in Mrs Stevenson and have, therefore, been able to create three smaller classes instead of two very large classes. This will undoubtedly support better progress for our students.

This has also enabled us to increase the number of students who are aiming to sit the higher tier GCSE Examination which will enable students to be awarded grades 4-9 at the end of Year 11. As always, we have the highest expectations of our students' capabilities and I know that aiming for the higher paper will be a positive step for all of them. It also allows us to move students between sets more easily which will enable us to offer more targeted in class interventions to ensure they are meeting their target grades.

To clarify the setting rationale; Set 10.1 and 10.2 are both following the higher specification and are, in essence, parallel sets when it comes to content, pace and level of challenge. I know that some students were concerned about moving from 10.1 to 10.2 but I would like to offer reassurance that both classes are being taught the same content and will sit the same examination.

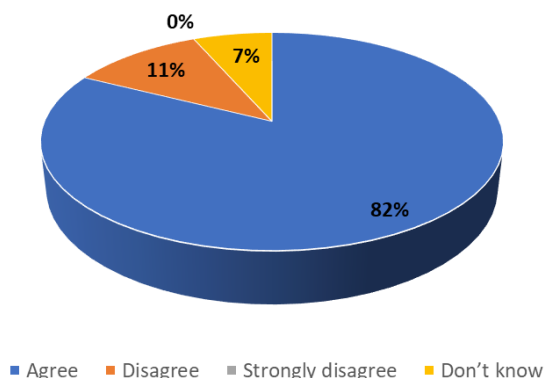

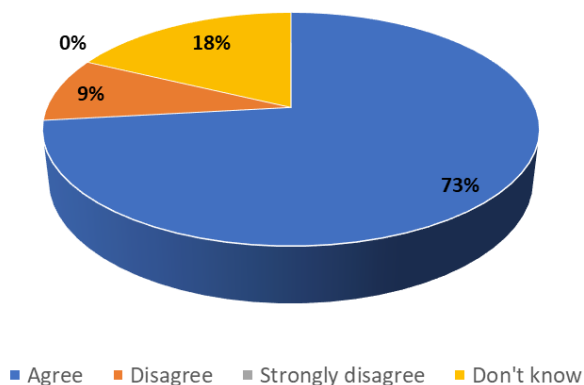

EPraise Parent Communication Website and App

To centralise and improve our communication, whilst facilitating you as a parent to see how well your child is getting on at school we are going to use EPraise. We have had access to EPraise for sometime and our students will be familiar with it as a reward system. However, we have invested in a wider range of functionality and we invite parents to register for an online account.



Logging In

You will initially need to register by downloading the EPraise App or by visiting their website via:

www.epraise.co.uk/index.php?school=stjohnscyprus&login=parents

1. Select the parent tab on the EPraise log in form
2. Click the register button.
3. Enter the email address previously provided to St John's School and request the login code
4. EPraise will send an email to the registered email account. This email contains a code, which you must then use as the password to login for the first time.

Note:

The password link remains active for 24 hours so you will need to create the password within that time or repeat the steps above to obtain a new email. Sometimes emails can take a few minutes to arrive or are automatically redirected to the junk folder so it is worth checking before re-registering your account.

EPraise Website Tabs

At the top of the webpage or app, there are a variety of tabs which link to the information details below:

Me > Settings

Here you can change your password, which we recommend to avoid obtaining a registration code each time you log on. Through the settings tab you can also set your notification preferences.



Me > Messages

Messages will eventually allow you to send and receive messages from your child's/children's teacher. At present it is our intention to use this facility to push out notifications to you as a parent. For example, letters and the weekly newsletter will come through EPraise Messages.

My Children > Profile

You can view your child's/children's profiles under the my Children Tab. Here you can see their school attendance, reward point tally and timetable. Further functionality will be launched in due course.

My Children > Planner

Here you will be able to view all of your child's/children's homework and notes set by their teachers. You will have the option to see any attachments included and can see which are set, due, overdue or completed. This aspect will become fully functional from Monday 30th October.

Community > Get Involved

Here you will see various enrichment activities available to your child/children and where you can sign them up. They even earn points indicated by the activities with praise points in the corner.

Community > Parents' Evening

You will soon be able to see allocated parents' afternoon events displayed here. When a parents' afternoon approaches, you will be able to book appointments to see their teacher. To do this simply select the 'book appointment' button and fill in the details. Further information will follow ahead of the Year 7 afternoon on Thursday 20th October 2022.

EPraise App Tabs

Profile

The first part of the App you land on is the profile of your child/children at St John's School. Here, for each child, you can obtain an overview of their reward point tally, a detailed breakdown of where these points have been accrued from and their current school attendance percentage, which can be clicked upon for more detail.



More > App > Settings

Found on the top right hand side of the App. You can find a more detailed menu and the links to the App's broader functionality. At the bottom of the menu, you can change your password under the header App > Settings.

More > Community

Under the More tab beneath the Community Header, you will also find:

- An overview of the various enrichment activities available to your child/children and where you can sign them up. They even earn points indicated by the activities with praise points in the corner
- A link to Parents' Evenings. When a parents' afternoon approaches, you will be able to book appointments to see their teacher. To do this simply select the 'book appointment' button and fill in the details. Further information will follow ahead of the Year 7 parents afternoon on Thursday 20th October 2022.
