Dear Families,

The week began with a visit to St John's School by 15 school and setting leaders in Cyprus for a Headteachers' Conference. It was a privilege to meet with them in order to share with them our school mission and underpinning priorities. This opportunity was followed up with a chance for students to show our visitors around our school, popping in and out of lessons in an effort to share best practice. Later in the week, I was able to meet up with these school leaders and others as part of the DCS Annual Headteachers' Conference, which took place in Limassol. The conference was a fantastic opportunity to share with other schools



and settings examples of best practice being undertaken at St John's School. Notably I spoke at length around the work we have done as a school in improving our safeguarding provision, as we continue to be championed as a school of best practice.



Elsewhere this week, Year 7 participated in a team building day organised by our PE Department. Taking place at Happy Valley, students participated in a wide variety of tasks that required them to work together in teams of varying sizes. I was pleased to be able to visit the students at Happy valley on Monday and it was great to see them all so engaged and working so well together.

On Wednesday we hosted our Year 9 Parents' Afternoon. As with previous Parents' Afternoons, it was great to see such high attendance. Listening to your feedback, I am confident that the offer of two Parents' Afternoons for all years is the right model and a significant improvement on what has gone before.

As the week draws to a close, students have attended school in their own clothes. Responding to parent feedback from last year, we have significantly reduced the number of non-school uniform days and plan to have three over the course of this academic year. Today's non-school uniform day serves two purposes - our support for Children in Need, but specifically to raise awareness amongst our students and the wider community around the need to stand up to bullying (more information to follow).




Year 9 Geographers erupted their homemade volcanoes by mixing bicarbonate of soda with vinegar!

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
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Homework Update




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Stand up to Bullying

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Assessment and Reporting

As part of our continual drive to eliminate educational disadvantage caused by mobility, we have carefully reviewed our assessment and reporting procedures so that all students and parents receive feedback that helps prepare them for examinations and gain great results. We aim to ensure that any under-performance is identified and tackled swiftly with the appropriate interventions. We want our students to feel like their academic progress is being monitored every step of the way, thereby giving them the confidence to excel academically.

To ensure we provide information to parents that is accurate and useful, the issue of reports and parent/teacher meetings are now as follows (this is a change to the published information in July 2022):

You will note that there are two parent / teacher meetings this year as opposed to the one last year. This will hopefully mean that we can deal with any issues that may arise during the academic year more swiftly and provide more opportunities for you to talk to all of your child's subject teachers.

You will also receive two progress reports each year which will tell you how well your child is doing in each subject, mapped against their target grades.

Very soon, after Christmas, we will also be inviting parents and carers in to school to hear more about what your child is studying in English, Maths and Science and how you might support them at home to ensure they gain the best possible results.

Once registered, to make your appointments, please visit the Community Tab after midday on Monday 21st November and select Parents' Evening. You can then follow the prompts to make appointments for your child's teachers.


It is a great opportunity to start thinking about the future and it will really help with both aspirations and UCAS applications.



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Attendance



Our whole school attendance currently stands at 94.8% and, although this is slightly below our target of 95%, which is the expectation set by the UK Government, I remain optimistic together we can meet and exceed this target. Thank you for your continued support around school attendance.

As previously shared, there is a direct link between good school attendance (greater

than 95%) and academic outcomes. At present, our whole school attendance compared to the same time period from the last academic year, shows an improvement of 2.8%, which is a fantastic measure of improvement and something we can all share in.



100% attendance – the very best chance of success. Well done if you currently have 100% attendance!



95%+ attendance – your attendance is good; well done and keep it up! Can you manage 100% attendance for a whole term?



93%+ attendance – try to improve on this, week by week. Intervention and support in school will be taking place.



Less than 93% - you should work hard to <u>immediately</u> improve your attendance. If you have any concerns, speak to your tutor. We will support you in any way we can.
