

#### Mathematics—An Update

#### Year 9

Now fully staffed, we are in a fortunate position to be able to offer all Year 9 students the opportunity to study GCSE statistics alongside their GCSE Mathematics course for the rest of Year 9 and into Year 10. This will mean that they will leave St John's School at the end of Year 11 with two full GCSE qualifications, one in Mathematics and one in Statistics.

In order to facilitate this; Year 9 will be having an assessment in the examination hall on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> March. This will enable us to set the students based on current attainment level in order for them to start the content of the GCSE Statistics.

From Easter, Year 9 will no longer be taught in mixed attainment groups for Maths.

This is a fantastic opportunity for the students, and we look forward to seeing them flourish in their new Mathematics classes.

#### Year 10

Year 10 are currently set into two large sets and one smaller set. I am very pleased that with the arrival of Mr O'Missenden we can better balance the number of students in each of sets to enable all students to get the best possible learning experiences in their lessons.

#### Year 11

Year 11 will sit a full series of Mathematics Mock examinations during the week commencing 6th March. This will give us yet another opportunity to track their progress and provide them with Question Level Analysis reports that will support their revision for the external examinations in May and June.

The examination will take place during the following lessons.

Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> period 1-2

Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> period 3-4

Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> period 3-4

The first of the two lessons from each examination are Mathematics lessons, so their other classes will be disrupted as little as possible.

Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode

Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics


