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Year 11 Prom

It is a pleasure to announce the date of this year's annual Year 11 Prom: Thursday 22nd June 2023, which will again be held at the Hill View in Pissouri, after the success of last year's event. This is a fantastic opportunity for Year 11 to celebrate the successes of their time at St John's School and we look forward to it being a fitting culmination of the hard work and efforts shown in school during this academic year.

The Prom is part of our Rewards Programme and a specific reward for Year 11 students who have demonstrated high levels of effort during Year 11. Students can become confident, respectful and successful learners by making the most of every opportunity offered to them, and it is these everyday efforts that we recognise in giving students the opportunity to take part in this special event.

This year we are introducing our Year 11 'Passport to Prom'. We know that Year 11 students who meet these expectations have the best opportunity for success in their examinations and all our Year 11 students are capable of achieving these goals. The criteria have been explained as part of a recent Year 11 assembly and are linked to:

- Attitude additional revision for core subjects
- Attendance to school
- Punctuality
- Uniform
- Completion of Tassomai courses
- Undertaking any extra work for any subject

Since February half term students have been able to gather stamps relating to the above areas and this will continue right through until the exams. Within the passport there are 60 available stamps, students will need to collect 35 to allow them to attend the event. If students fully commit to their studies and manage to gain 45 stamps they will be entitled to 25% off the price of their tickets. We must be clear though that students who do not collect 35 stamps will not be eligible for a ticket, although other year group awards will still be accessible.

We understand that enabling our students to reach their potential over the coming weeks will be hugely influenced by the support at home and we would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support.
