Supporting young people during exam time

The next month is going to be a stressful time for young people sitting exams – and for the adults supporting them. It's normal for young people to feel stressed or anxious about exams. However, if you notice significant changes to their mood, behaviour, eating or sleeping patterns that don't go away after a few weeks, this may be a sign that their [exam stress](#) has started to negatively impact their mental health. THE EXAM SEASON

What do the exam days look like?

My child does not have an exam

- Your child will come into school as normal on this day.
- They will work in lessons as usual.
- If they have a lesson where the curriculum is complete (i.e. they have sat the final exams) students will partake in supervised revision for subjects still to be examined.

My child has a morning exam

0800 breakfast
0815 period 1 as usual
0915 pre-exam revision
1015 break
1035 extended break
1045 go to exam room
1100 exam start

At the end of the exam students will continue with the school day.

Additional time will be given for breaks where needed.

My child has an afternoon exam

With advance permission from you, students may have a later start on days when they have an afternoon exam. A bus will be provided from Akrotiri.

1230 arrive at school
1235 break
1300 pre-exam revision
1400 lunch available
students stay on-site
1515 arrive at exam room
1530 exam start

My child has two exams in one day

0800 breakfast
0815 period 1 as usual
0915 pre-exam revision
1015 break
1035 extended break

1215-1330 exam finish - students go to lessons

1300 pre-exam revision
1400 lunch available
students stay onsite
1515 arrive at exam room
1530 exam start

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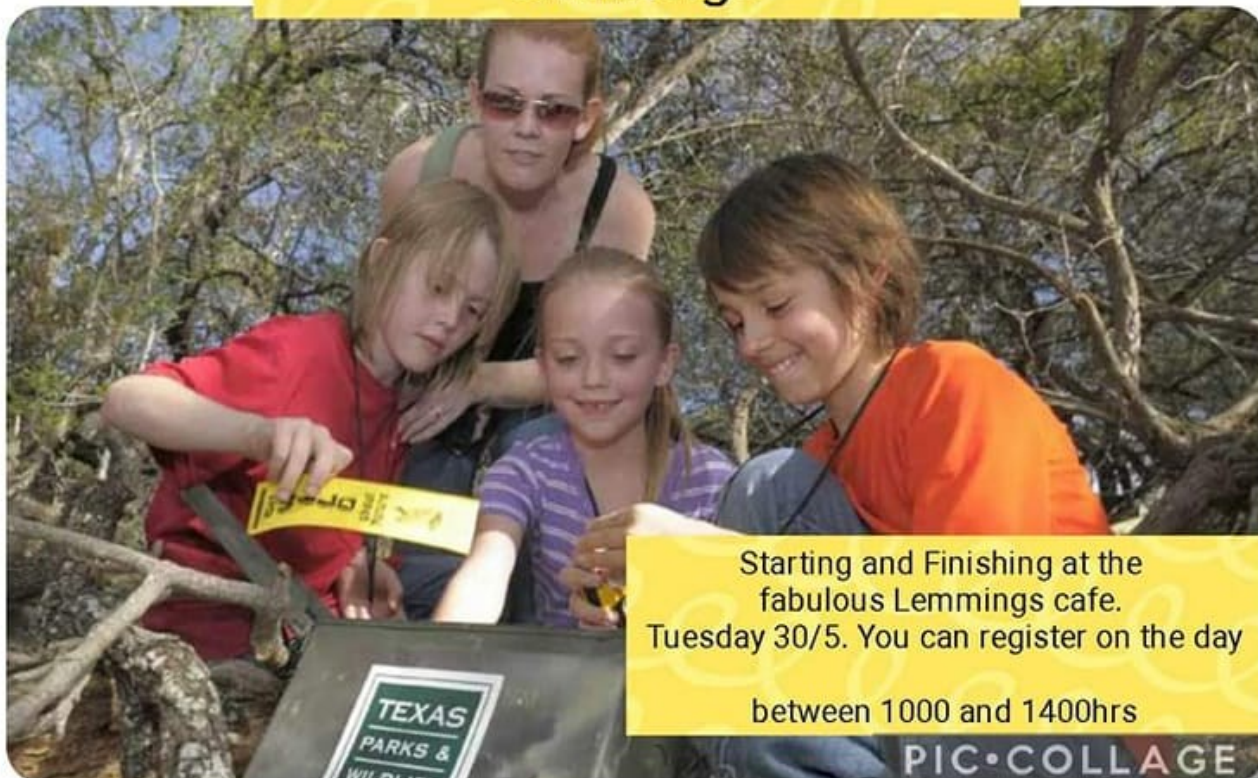
