There were several personal highlights of this past week.




On Tuesday, I had the privilege to hear from six of our Year 12 students as they presented their views and

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School Values

You will hopefully recall from previous editions of this weekly newsletter, and from your own participation, that we have been consulting stakeholders around the future of our whole school values. The values of our school have long been Excellence, Leadership and Learning. Over the past couple of months, students, staff and parents had the opportunity to hear from representatives of the Army, Civil Service, Navy and Royal Air Force, who shared the values of their respective Service. Choosing from the values of each Service in an effort to align our school closer to the community we serve, we have arrived at a new set of school values.

Integrity

The value of Integrity is common across all of our Services, be it Army, Civil Service, Navy and Royal Air Force. It was also the value that each and every stakeholder group identified as being one of their most preferred priorities for St John's School. Consequently, deciding upon the value of Integrity was easy and for ease of understanding it has been qualified as <u>'doing the right thing'</u>.

Commitment

A great deal of emphasis from adult stakeholders was placed upon the value of resilience in order to ensure the young people in our care reach their potential. Extensive discussion followed around the need to encourage students to do their best, particularly in face of any disadvantage they may face as a result of mobility. The discussion also commented upon our shared community commitment to eliminating educational disadvantage and it was from this discussion that we arrived at the Value of Commitment as shared by the Army and Royal Navy. Commitment at St John's School is to be demonstrated through 'a determination to succeed'.

Respect

The value of Respect was universally the most preferred value of all as chosen by our students. A value common across the Tri Service, it is a value that, together with that of Integrity, will further promote the harmonious and healthy school environment that exists at St John's School, underpinning the whole school improvement priorities that link to student satisfaction and staff wellbeing. In showing Respect at St John's School, 'we value ourselves and others'.

A formal launch of our school values will follow in September 2023 and underpin a student and staff charter that will soon be developed.

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Progress Tests

Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 will sit Progress Tests in English, Maths and Science this coming week.

Progress Tests were used at the beginning of this academic year and now again at the end of this academic year. They are designed to measure attainment and allow comparison at an individual, cohort and school level with national averages.

Each test assesses a student's knowledge, understanding and application in the core subjects, helping to externally validate student attainment against national benchmarks as the academic year comes to an end. For students continuing at St John's School in the new academic year these tests will help to indicate possible gaps in learning in order to inform interventions. Detailed reports are obtained from these tests, which will be made available to parents. Each report analyses key dimensions of learning for each subject and provides staff with question-by-question breakdown to help identify those students who require greater challenge and those who may need extra support.

The purpose of doing so is to externally validate teacher assessment and track progress at an individual and cohort level. Individual reports will show you as the parent how your child is performing against standardised national expectations, whilst providing specific suggestions for addressing areas for development. Cohort reports will provide me, my senior and middle leaders with a higher level view to inform class-wide activity, as well as staff training and development needs ahead of the new academic year.
