

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

In recent weeks I undertook interviews for the vacant position of Deputy Head Teacher. This position has been vacant and covered by my extended leadership team since December 2022, when Mrs Alex Kerr left. I am delighted to announce that Mr Stephen Dixon, who has been our Assistant Head Teacher since September 2022, has been successfully appointed to the role of Deputy Head Teacher from September 2023, once the Civil Service recruitment ban has been lifted.

Mr Dixon has led upon significant changes associated with our educational offer and curriculum development and I look forward to

him continuing this work within his new role.



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#### **English Vacancy**

You may have heard that Miss Athy Pallas, one of our English teachers, is leaving at the end of this academic year. Athy leaves us for a promoted position at a school in North London.

Athy's departure after 17 years of service to St John's School and the WSBA community leaves a vacancy, one that unfortunately cannot be recruited for on a permanent basis owing to a national ban on recruitment across the Civil Service. To mitigate any impact upon our students, we are spoilt with as many as six qualified English teachers on island all of whom are already employed in various roles by St John's School. I am expecting to be in a position to provide further details upon who will replace Athy on a temporary basis next week.
