Fiji Day — Tuesday 10th October

Fiji Day, the celebration of Fiji's Independence, is fast approaching. To celebrate this day and let students get a taste of Fiji's culture, the *Community Student Committee* have organised food for our students during second break on Friday 13th October.

The food being offered will be food most Fijians eat on a day to day basis and will also include a range of sweet treats. Cake and desserts will range from 50 cent to €2 whereas the main meals will either be portions equal to the Snack Shack for €2.50 or larger portions for €5 consist of a main dish with a side portion of rice. The price charged will cover the costs of the ingredients with any profits being saved for future school initiatives to be organised by the Student Leadership Team.



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External Quality Assurance Visit

On Monday 16th and Tuesday 17th October St John's School will be visited by an educational consultant. The consultant is a former secondary Headteacher and an experienced and practicing Ofsted Inspector who has worked extensively with secondary schools in England.


The educational consultant will work with the senior leadership teams of King Richard School and St John's School as well as their respective middle leaders to help prepare for a future school inspection through the use of the current Ofsted Framework. This external quality assurance visit is independent of any provided by the Department of Children's Services and will help to evaluate, and then shape, our trajectory of school improvement.

The quality assurance visit will focus upon what is happening in lessons through lesson visits and subsequent conversations with students. After school hours there will be an in-depth focus on our school's safeguarding practices and SEND provision. The consultant will also meet with Curriculum Leaders and Governors.



As with an Ofsted Inspection we are keen to formally capture the views of parents. On Monday 17th October between 1600 and 1700hrs the consultant will host a parent drop in session in the school hall, to which you are all cordially invited.

Should you be unable to visit you are encouraged to share your views of our school through the <u>Ofsted Parent View website</u>. Should we have enough responses the consultant will be able to draw upon these views in her final report. The Ofsted Parent View website can be found <u>here</u>. 
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Grease—School Production
