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

Preparations for this are well under way and further details will be announced when they are finalised. As we run up to this event we like to encourage our Y11 students to maximise their exam potential by attending school, completing extra work and taking part in revisions sessions. Each time that they achieve one of these they can gain a stamp from their teacher with the aim of filling the passport and gaining an invite to the final event.

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

As we head into the final stretch we want to give you something extra to aim for. Prom is a privilege and with that in mind we introduce the Passport to Prom.

This passport allows you to get rewarded for striving to get the best possible grades. Inside the passport are all the ways you can earn stamps these include attending school and completing extra work.

You will need to gain 40 of these stamps in order to be eligible a Prom ticket. The time period in which to gain these is between 22nd Jan - 27th May.

If you manage to get 55 stamps you will be offered 10% off your prom ticket.
