

This week's submissions come from Year 7, who have produced some insightful posters about Shakespeare's life.




### William Shakespeare



- Also known as: Bard of Avon, Swan of Avon
- Born April 23 1564, Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwickshire, England died April 23, 1616,
- English poet, dramatist, and actor often called the English national poet and considered by many to be the greatest dramatist of all time.
- Shakespeare spent his early life in Stratford-upon-Avon, receiving at most a grammar-school education, and at age 18 he married a local woman, Anne Hathaway.
- William Shakespeare had three children: Susanna and twins Judith and Hamnet.
- Altogether Shakespeare's works include 38 plays, 2 narrative poems, 154 sonnets, and a variety of other poems.
- Shakespeare died in Stratford-upon-Avon at the age of 52. He is buried in the sanctuary of the parish church, Holy Trinity.
- Interesting Fact—Anagram of William Shakespeare is "I am a weakish speller"











#### WHO WAS HE?

William Shakespeare was a famous playwriter, estimated to be born on the 23rd of April 1564 but back then they did not keep birth certificates but from what we have deciphered from his baptism dates we assume that this was his birth date.
