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


As the event progresses, students and parents will be invited to branch off into one of three breakout sessions as follows:

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

LEONARDO DA VINCI

Most people think 'Mona Lisa', when you say Leonardo Da Vinci, but in fact he was a creative engineer and mathematician, with ideas beyond his time, which makes him fascinating for me.

Da Vinci incredibly thought of designs that could not always be created with the resources and technology that they had in his generation. He was never afraid to look past the boundaries of the average mind and invented many devices and contraptions which were the foundation to machines that we have today, such as the Helicopter, tank, aircraft and scuba gear etc.







Aerial screw = early helicopter

Diving contraption = scuba gear

Armoured car = modern tank

Surprisingly, even though Leonardo was a pacifist, many of his designs were military machines. Da Vinci was a problem solver and knew being mobile was vital. His 'triple canon' design, was light and fast, rather than heavy and fixed like cannons of his time. He made armies more mobile by creating the 'revolving bridge' that could cross rivers and moats and could be packed up and moved easily.

Many of his designs were inspired by his study of nature, such as his armoured car (an early tank) with a turtle shell-like protective roof and his flying machine based on a bird's skeleton.

Most interestingly, Bill Gates, a famous STEM king bought Leonardo's design notebooks. Can there be any better STEM ruler, than this Renaissance engineer?
