St John's is a wonderful school that overlooks the Mediterranean Sea from Episkopi in the Western Sovereign Base Area. Serving the military community in British Forces Cyprus we educate 300 students from 11 to 18 years.

As a Ministry of Defence School, we are committed to eliminating educational disadvantage caused by mobility. To this end, we aspire to provide an educational offer that is consistently 'Good' and ensure that St John's School ranks in the Top 5% of schools nationally for student progress.



Blessed with a wealth of resources, housed in excellent, well maintained accommodation we provide our students with experienced subject specialists, who teach classes that average below twenty. Behaviour is outstanding, student satisfaction in their schooling exceeds the national average and parents report that their child's experience surpasses that of their previous school. Consequently, St John's School is well placed to eliminate the educational disadvantage that may otherwise be caused by mobility.

Responding to our unique setting, where student mobility is extremely high, Assessment for Learning (AFL) acts as our tool in eliminating educational disadvantage caused by mobility. Underpinning the planning of each and every lesson, AFL strategies are skilfully employed by staff to ensure gaps in a student understanding are quickly identified, then closed through differentiated activities that are carefully planned to provide bespoke levels of support and challenge in response to each child's prior educational coverage.

Complementing our classroom provision, we aim to develop, in all of our students our key values of *Excellence, Learning and Leadership*. Embraced by all, we know it is these qualities that will help them be resilient, successful, and responsible in their lives whilst living in Cyprus and beyond.

With the notable exception of an earlier start and finish, relative to the UK, and the absence of lunchtime, a typical day at St John's is very similar to that of any school.

* Tutorial time begins at 08.00. This 15 minutes spent with their Form Tutor, sets the scene for the day with uniform, equipment and homework checks being the routine, interspersed with school assemblies and a discussion of the Theme for the Week. This is followed by two 1 hour lessons. First break is after this and for most students this is the equivalent of lunchtime back home.

Two more lessons separate the first and second break. Second break is 25 minutes long and is a good time for the students to enjoy a range of additional activities on offer, for example PE, board games or homework clubs.

One more lesson separates this break from the end of the main school day.

** There are always a range of after school clubs and activities. These change each term and a full and up to date list will be published each half-term.

Behaviour Policy



Positive behaviour for excellent learning at St John's School

C1 - First Warning

Your teacher will inform you that your behaviour is not acceptable and explore what support you may need to continue learning and allow others to learn.

C2 - Second Warning

If your negative behaviour choices continue, your teacher will remind you again of the expectations. They may also inform you that this is the final reminder before a sanction will be set

C3 - Consequence

Your teacher will record that your negative behaviour choices have not improved and will contact home. You will also be required to sit a Pastoral Detention to discuss how your behaviour has impacted others and their ability to learn.

C4 - Relocation to SLT

Your teacher will inform you that your negative behaviour is now stealing the learning of others. Therefore, you will now be relocated to work with the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher. A phone call home will follow and an appropriate sanction will be set.

Attendance



Good attendance at school is the most fundamental requirement for a successful education

Expectations

The school expects students to attend regularly as there is a clear link between good attendance and high achievement.

Regular attendance is defined by HM Government as 96% or above, which is equal to no more than 7 schools day absences each academic year.

Impact of School Absence

Research shows that with every extra day of school missed a child's chances of achieving 5 or more good GCSEs or equivalent at grades including in English and mathematics is lowered.

Children missing a week of school are 2.2 times less likely to achieve 5 or more good GCSEs or equivalent at grades including in English and mathematics and 4.7 times less likely to achieve the gold standard English Baccalaureate (EBacc).

Reporting Absence

Absence from School in Term Time

St John's School is committed to working with parents to help every child achieve their full potential through regular school attendance. We therefore do not expect parents to take their children out of school in term time and it should not be assumed that a request for term time absence will authorised.

The law does not grant parents an automatic right to take their child out of school during term time. Any absence from school will disrupt your child's learning. You may consider that a holiday will be educational, but your child will still miss out on the teaching that their peers receive. Children returning from a term time absence are also unprepared for the lessons which build on the teaching they have missed. Teachers then have to give more time to help individual children catch up on missed work. This poses a potential risk of the underachievement of other students in the class. This is something we all have a responsibility to avoid.

Every overseas command location has an allocated Education Welfare Officer. The team sits within the Specialist Support Services branch of Defence Children Services. The service is Quadservice, supporting all Army, Navy, RAF and Civilian families overseas.

All EWOs are experienced practitioners with a range of knowledge and skills relating to education, social care, military and local authority education welfare. We are a voluntary support service, available to support children and families where any attendance related issues or concerns are raised.

Contextual Absence

Within the military context there may be some extenuating reasons for school absence; amongst these are authorised absences for post operational leave purposes. This will be granted as per MOD Schools guidelines on request.

If you consider that your request warrants special consideration, you will need to complete a **'Leave of Absence' form** in advance.

A response will be sent to you as soon as possible. If the absence is not considered to be a special circumstance, and you nevertheless take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

In the case of an unauthorised absence, the Unit Welfare Officer maybe notified.
