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Relate—Young People's Counselling

Background

HQ BFC have successfully secured access to <u>Relate</u>, a virtual counselling service that has long supported military personnel and families over the past decade, having delivered over 6000 counselling session annually. As part of a twelve month pilot, this service has been extended to serving personnel, with an assignment order to British Forces Cyprus.

What is Relate?

<u>Relate</u> is a free service provided to BFC personnel and their family members with a wide range of relationship counselling services with as many as six counselling sessions provided virtually to individuals, couples, families and children aged 11-18.

How do I access Relate Counselling Services?

You can access the services provided by Relate at Family Action by self referring though the <u>ACF/Relate</u> <u>-Referral-Form</u> Alternatively, you can email <u>armycentralfund@relate.org.uk</u> quoting the Service Persons Service Number. Young people can be referred by a parent.
