Student Voice

Last week we surveyed our students on their views of our school and their educational experience. The results come at a time of the year where we are undertaking our review of the past year and planning ahead for next. The student feedback and follow up focus group interviews will feed directly into our preparations for the next academic year.

Some of the headline results from the students are as follows:

89% of students report that they enjoy school

95% of students feel that the work set challenges them.

86% of students state that behaviour is good in lessons



91% of students would recommend St John's School

51% of students want more careers advice and guidance

57% of students report that the school encourages them to look after their fitness and healthy eating.

70% of students participate in after school activities



PE Uniform for September 2025 onwards

Over the past year Nike Pro Training shorts have become increasingly popular amongst students participating in Physical Education (PE). The shorts and similar compression-style athletic shorts (pictured) are made to be close fitting with stretchy material and from September 2025 will no longer be permitted to be worn for PE.



This decision has been made in order to uphold the school's standards for

appropriate dress, ensure a consistent and respectful learning environment for all students, and maintain a focus on physical activity over personal attire. While Nike Pro shorts are popular for athletic performance, they are not aligned with the school's expectations for modesty and uniformity during school hours.

Approved PE attire includes the following:

- Loose-fitting black athletic shorts of mid-thigh length or longer
- PE T-shirts provided by the school
- Athletic shoes suitable for physical activity

Suitable loose-fitting black athletic shorts can be purchased from school directly for €5 or elsewhere.

Students who arrive to PE in non-compliant attire, including Nike Pro shorts, will in the first instance be asked to change with repeated non-compliance being addressed through the use of our behaviour policy.

- Adolescent Booster (includes MEN ACWY and Td/IPV) Given in Year 9



St John's School Writers

This term, Year 8 are reading George Orwell's 'Animal Farm' and learning about its function as an allegory for the Russian Revolution and, more broadly, tyranny and conflict in society as a whole.

The following piece of writing demonstrates an astute awareness of these broad themes and how they are exemplified through Orwell's characterisation of Snowball and Boxer.


Why are Snowball and Boxer the heroes of the Battle of the Cowshed?

The absurdity of animals taking over a human farm will be emphasised in viral strings of gossip. There will probably also be discussion of how to solve the problem of the custody of the farm. Humans would have been trying to demonise the animals so that eventually Mr Jones will regain his farm. He has also tried his hardest to prevent people from developing favour towards these deviant animals. The Battle of the Cowshed is a pivotal moment when mankind attempts to seize power and are wonderfully defeated.

Snowball had the brains to orchestrate the battle in a way that assured them victory and Boxer delivered the hit which frightened the men enough to make them run away and be almost certainly too afraid to come back for a while.

Orwell might have wanted the readers to feel sympathy for Boxer, the carthorse, who has been forced into such violence. He also might be trying to paint Snowball as an inconsiderate character as he brushes

Boxer's concerns away and discounts his grief. Boxer felt remorse: "He is dead, Boxer said sorrowfully." This builds a sense of sympathy between the reader and the horse. It also shows the harshness of Snowball's reply in cold juxtaposition. "War is war. The only good human is a dead one." This crude statement might be the start of Orwell building a sense of resentment towards Snowball's coldness, similar to the resentment that the reader, and the animals, would have felt towards Mr Jones, the farmer. The political parallels are emerging and Orwell is clearly demonstrating that those who wish to have power should not be allowed. As the famous quote claims "Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely. Great men are almost always bad men, even when they exercise influence and not authority."
