

Preparing for the New Academic Year

<u>Uniform</u>

There are a number of opportunities to purchase uniform items from school and/or the Akrotiri Hive (27th August) during the final week of the school holidays. Parents are reminded that there is no longer an expectation for students to wear a polo shirt with the school logo and have the opportunity to purchase plain white polo shirts without logo instead.

Responding to stakeholder feedback, we will, as a school, be enforcing the expectation that the school skirts should not be shortened or rolled up and therefore be no shorter than 10cm above the knee.



Piercings

Should your child be considering a piercing this summer, they are encouraged to get this done at the start of the holidays. Students are permitted studs in either ear and we will permit a single nose stud, reflecting this change in policy over the summer. All other piercings will need to be removed. All piercings must be removed when participating in PE.

Fashion Accessories

Students are reminded that all acrylic or gel nails must be removed prior to the first day of school. We will permit subtle nail varnish colours and will reflect this change in policy over the summer. Please also note that

hair colours not deemed as natural are also not permitted.

Equipment

It is essential that students arrive to school equipped to learn. They are required to have the essential items shown and these will be checked daily by their tutor.





PE Uniform for September 2025 onwards

Over the past year Nike Pro Training shorts have become increasingly popular amongst students participating in Physical Education (PE). The shorts and similar compression-style athletic shorts (pictured) are made to be close fitting with stretchy material and from September 2025 will no longer be permitted to be worn for PE.



This decision has been made in order to uphold the school's standards for

appropriate dress, ensure a consistent and respectful learning environment for all students, and maintain a focus on physical activity over personal attire. While Nike Pro shorts are popular for athletic performance, they are not aligned with the school's expectations for modesty and uniformity during school hours.

Approved PE attire includes the following:

- Loose-fitting black athletic shorts of mid-thigh length or longer
- PE T-shirts provided by the school
- Athletic shoes suitable for physical activity

Suitable loose-fitting black athletic shorts can be purchased from school directly for €5 or elsewhere.

Students who arrive to PE in non-compliant attire, including Nike Pro shorts, will in the first instance be asked to change with repeated non-compliance being addressed through the use of our behaviour policy.

School Buses
