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
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Engagement in the Curriculum – ‘Switch On’

As we continue exploring the **Commitment** segment of our Learning Circle, this week we’re focusing on **Engagement**; the habit of fully involving ourselves in learning. Being engaged means more than simply being present in the classroom. It’s about showing curiosity, asking thoughtful questions, contributing to discussions and taking an active role in your own progress. When students engage deeply with their lessons, they not only understand content more clearly but also develop the confidence to tackle more challenging ideas.

Engagement is also contagious. When one person participates with enthusiasm, it often encourages others to do the same. A focused, lively atmosphere helps everyone learn better, and teachers can tailor their teaching more effectively when students show interest and involvement. Staying engaged doesn’t mean being perfect; it means staying present, trying your best, and showing a willingness to keep going even when the topic is complex or unfamiliar. Small actions like listening closely, offering ideas, or completing tasks with care all add up to big improvements over time.

Discussion at Home: Chat together about what helps you or your child feel most engaged in learning. Is it asking questions? Working with others? Breaking tasks into smaller steps? Think about one simple strategy to try this week to boost engagement, either in schoolwork or something at home
