Aspire Trip to York

This week, Aspire students enjoyed an unforgettable three-day residential trip to the historic city of York. The visit was packed with exciting experiences, hands-on learning, and opportunities to explore future pathways, and it was a fantastic showcase of our students' enthusiasm, maturity, and ambition.

On day one, students stepped back in time at the Jorvik Viking Centre, where immersive rides and interactive displays brought York's Viking history vividly to life. Students learned about daily life, trade, and housing in the Viking city of Jorvik, helping them visualise what the city would have been like over 1,000 years ago. This was followed by a city sightseeing tour, allowing students to see many of York's famous landmarks and learn more about its Roman and medieval past. Later, the group visited the York Chocolate Story, where students discovered York's proud chocolate-making heritage, including famous brands such as Rowntree and Terry's. The highlight for many was creating their own white chocolate lollipop, which they were able to design and take home.

On day two, students visited the National Army Museum, where they explored British military history and even had the rare opportunity to hold original weapons from the Battle of Waterloo. The group then visited the York Castle Museum, which offered something for everyone — from historic prison cells and dungeons to 1960s fashion displays and retro children's games. The excitement continued at the York Dungeons, where actors, special effects, and storytelling brought York's darker history to life. Students were thoroughly scared (in the best way!) and left buzzing with excitement. A quick shopping visit to The Shambles and Primark was also squeezed in and enjoyed by all.

During the residential stay, hostel staff praised the St John students for their impeccable behaviour, respectful attitudes, and excellent routines, including going to bed on time — something not all visiting schools managed! Our students were outstanding ambassadors for the school throughout the trip.

On day three, students visited both the University of York and York St John University, where they learned about courses, accommodation, and university life, helping to raise aspirations and inspire future goals. A huge thank you goes to all the staff who supported the trip, giving up their time and energy to ensure it ran smoothly and safely. Their dedication made this experience possible.

Overall, the York trip was a huge success and a brilliant example of the opportunities Aspire offers. Applications for next year's Aspire cohort for current Year 7 students will open around Easter, and we look forward to welcoming the next group of Aspire students.

Promoting Independence and Accountability in the Sixth Form

Following consultation with our Student Leadership Team and the School Governors, we are pleased to share a new initiative designed to further promote independence within the Sixth Form, while ensuring that students remain accountable for their actions and choices.

From this term, we will be trialling a **red** and **green** system, with an **amber** stage to be introduced in the new academic year. During non-timetabled periods, students who are on **green** will have the freedom to choose how they use their time. This may include remaining in school to work in the study room or relax in the common room or choosing to leave the school premises or go home. This approach reflects our commitment to treating our Sixth Form students as young adults and supporting them in developing the self-management skills they will need beyond school.

Students will remain on **green** provided they are up to date with deadlines, demonstrate a positive attitude and engagement in lessons, and maintain attendance above 96% over a fortnightly period. Where these expectations are not met, a student may be moved to **red**. In this instance, these freedoms will be temporarily rescinded, and the student will be required to work in the study room during all non-timetabled periods. Students placed on **red** will remain so for the following fortnight, after which the process will restart and progress will be reviewed.

We believe this system strikes an appropriate balance between independence and responsibility, and we look forward to working closely with students and families as we trial this approach.

Year 9 GCSE Options Process - Important Information for Parents

We have now begun the GCSE options process for our Year 9 students. Over the coming weeks, students will be encouraged to think carefully about the subjects they may wish to study in Years 10 and 11, considering their interests, strengths, and future aspirations.

As a first step, parents/carers of Year 9 students have been sent an online GCSE Options Interest Canvass via email. This canvass is not the final options form, but it is a crucial part of the process. It helps the school understand students' subject interests so that option blocks can be created to allow as many students as possible to access their preferred subjects.

We strongly encourage parents and carers to discuss subject choices with their child and complete the canvass together.

If you have not received the email containing the link, or if you experience any difficulties accessing the form, please contact the school as soon as possible so we can ensure all responses are received.



Key Stage 3 Valentine School Disco




