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School Buses

Students who were in attendance at St John's School will continue to ride their allocated bus to school come September. For new students, parents will have received a letter notifying them of the number of the school bus their child(ren) have been allocated for the next academic year.



On the first Thursday and Friday of the new school year, students travelling from Akrotiri will be met by senior staff at the respective bus stops and be allocated their seat. Students can make changes to their allocated seating by visiting the Pastoral Hub in the Autumn Term.

If you are expecting your child to travel to school from Akrotiri by bus and have not registered and/or received a letter your child can still travel upon the bus. On their respective first day your child will need to make their way to either the Chaplaincy or Chelona, previously known as Wateringhole on the first day of term. They will be met by a senior member of staff who will allocate them a seat, which maybe changed at a later date.

Preparing for the New Academic Year

Piercings

Should your child be considering a piercing this summer, they are encouraged to get this done at the start of the holidays. Students are permitted studs in either ear and we will permit a single nose stud, reflecting this change in policy over the summer. All other piercings will need to be removed. All piercings must be removed when participating in PE.

Fashion Accessories

Students are reminded that all acrylic or gel nails must be removed prior to the first day of school. We will permit subtle nail varnish colours and will reflect this change in policy over the summer. Please also note that hair colours not deemed as natural are also not permitted.

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Uniform Changes from September 2026

A reminder that our school uniform is changing. As initially communicated in September 2025, and at intervals throughout this academic year, we are making changes to our school uniform which will begin to come into effect from September 2026.

We have timed the change to ensure students arriving in September 2026 can procure new items of uniform that will last the duration of their time with us. We will phase in the uniform changes over two years to ensure parents are able to get good value for money out of the items already purchased and being worn. For students already enrolled at St John's School, they will be able to continue to wear existing items of uniform up to July 2027. The key changes are as follows:

- Students identifying to any gender will be required to wear black tailored shorts. The shorts must be mid-thigh in length. Shorts must not be tightfitting and/or of a stretchy material.
- All students are required to wear a white polo shirt, however there is no requirement to wear a polo shirt with a school logo, which will no longer be restocked and is being discontinued.
- For PE, students must wear black sports shorts, which are not compression shorts. Students are required to wear a white t-shirt with a single small logo no larger than a £2 or €2 coin. There will no longer be a requirement for students to wear a PE T-Shirt that features the house of Poseidon or Apollo. Responding to parent feedback plain white Dri-Fit t-shirts can be purchased from the school.
- Students will be able to wear our school hoodie, which will be available to purchase from school. No other jumper or hoodie will be permitted to be worn. The school blazer, which has long proved unpopular with students will no longer be restocked and is being discontinued.

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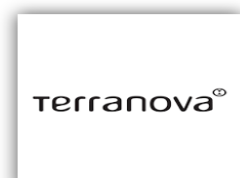
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Uniform Changes from September 2026

Black tailored shorts suitable for school must be mid-thigh in length. Shorts must not be tight fitting and/or of a stretchy material. Parents can purchase shorts adhering to these rules either from school uniform providers or adult retail providers such as Next. Students have flexibility in style as long as the shorts remain mid-thigh in length and not tight fitting or made from a stretchy material.



Parents are encouraged to purchase generic uniform items including shorts (either child or adult sizes/styles) and polo shirts from instore or online retails here in Cyprus or in the UK. We have been in store and online and found suitable items in the following retailers:





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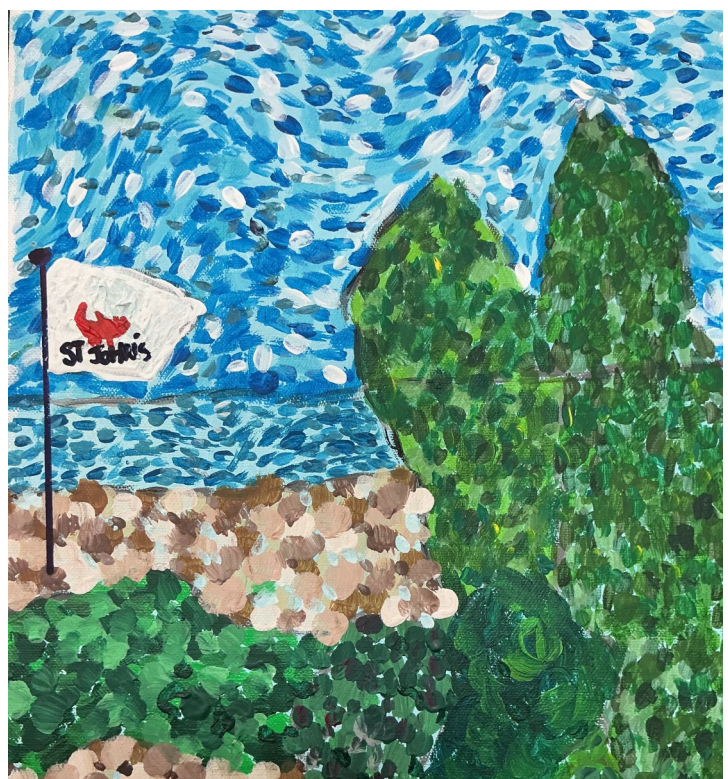


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Year 5 RAF Akrotiri Primary School Art Work
